Porritt School serves the community of Tamatea, Napier. Our school is Decile 4, and has a current roll of 355 students. Established in 1975, we are a contributing school of students in Years 0-6.

We have a highly engaged and supportive whānau, and are well served by a dedicated, capable Board of Trustees, and an amazing Home and School group.

We have a team of committed, passionate support staff, teachers and learning support people. Our staff team is diverse, with a wide variety of professional strengths and passions in education. We are keen to work hard and constantly ask ourselves, our tamariki and whānau, how we might best deliver a model of education for our tamariki that is responsive, future focused and personalised, allowing our tamariki and whānau to be affirmed in who they are, and to flourish now and in the future.

BEGINNING SCHOOL AT PORRITT

Our Early Childhood Education to Porritt School transition is;

- Flexible
- Responsive to the needs of children and their families
- Focuses on the wellbeing of the child.

Our process reflects best practice in ECE to school transitions.

There are five steps to the enrolment process at Porritt School;

Step 1: Hui with Maaka Papuni, our principal, to take a tour of the kura, and create a personal connection (for new families to our school).

Step 2: Completion of enrolment application

Step 3: The organisation of transition visits alongside transition visit coordinator Leanne Heaven

Step 4: Learner begins the transition visits, meeting key teaching staff and support staff alongside whānau and caregivers

Step 5: Learner progresses through transition visits and begins school on or after their 5th birthday
